About our Sunday Preachers



Becky Short is Assistant chaplain at the Roman catholic Chaplaincy. She is a D Phil student in French.



Katie Tuppling studied for ministry at Wycliffe hall, and recently returned to Oxford to take up a post in the Diocese as Chaplain to the Deaf Community and Disability Advisor. She has authored two books on disability, and is the founding member of the “Disability and Jesus” network.



Ruth Hake is staff chaplain to the Royal Air Force. She was awarded an MBE for ‘her selfless commitment and outstanding support to service personnel and their families when they have needed her most, irrespective of belief or status’.



Anthony Bash practised as a Solicitor before studying theology. He is Vice-Master and Senior Tutor at Hatfield College, Durham, and is also the College Chaplain and an Honorary Professor in the Department of Theology and Religion. His work majors on forgiveness and reconciliation in a modern setting, with a current focus on remorse.



Nicholas King is a Jesuit Priest who taught for many years in South Africa, and then at Oxford University, where he has now returned as Assistant Catholic Chaplain. He has taught New Testament and Greek at the University of Oxford, and recently published a translation of the entire Greek Bible into English.

Anu Vasirani, Choir Librarian, organises and collates choir music and keeps on top of our vast and growing library.



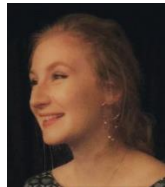
James Potter, Chapel Music Advisor works with the Chaplain and Organ Scholars on all aspects of Chapel music.
